IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BUDGET IN 2021



Essentials of the Monthly Financial Reporting Statements September 2021 (Council Doc C5-05.1A)

Income:

The recovery of 2021 contributions, with a percentage of 80.19%, lower than last year (84.60%) and the average on the last 5 years (84.09%).

Difficult to judge if there are COVID effects coursing to lower payment rate.

Income (continued):

- 2 Member States have not paid their 2019 contributions yet.
- 5 Member States have not paid their 2020 contributions yet.
- Contributions received in advance for 2021 from 3 Member States.
- Kenya was welcomed as a new IHO Member State.
- Democratic Republic of Congo has paid its arrears and is now reinstated as IHO Member State suspended since 1983.

International Hydrographic Organization

Expenditure:

- The current <u>end of year surplus</u> for 2021 is estimated to be 465.000 €.
- There is less expenditure compared to budget on Personnel Costs (207.000 €),
 Operating costs (250.000 €) and capital expenditure (8.000 €).

COVID effects on personal costs and operational costs including travel.
