


Figure 1. Plot of depth and accumulation of raster cells along main thalweg path, with fitted curve.




Figure 2. Modified version of Fig 6. (Zimmermann &Prescott, 2018) "Thalwegs of the Umnak Canyon area of the eastern Bering Sea slope" showing proposed location for Agligadak Canyon place name.
